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February is Dental Care Month. Dental care for young children is crucial for establishing good oral hygiene habits and maintaining overall health. Here are some important tips from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for taking care of young children's dental health:

- Start Early: Begin oral care as soon as your child's first tooth erupts. Clean the gums with a soft, damp cloth before teeth appear, and then switch to a small, soft-bristled toothbrush.
- Establish a Routine: Create a daily routine for brushing and flossing. Brush
 your child's teeth at least twice a day, in the morning and before bedtime.
 Flossing can begin when teeth start touching.
- Supervise Brushing: Young children may not have the hand dexterity to brush effectively on their own. Supervise their brushing to ensure they cover all surfaces of their teeth and use the correct technique.
- Visit the Dentist Early: Schedule your child's first dental visit by their first birthday or when their first tooth appears. Early dental visits help monitor oral development, and the dentist can provide guidance on proper care.

- Healthy Diet: Limit sugary snacks and beverages in your child's diet.
 Encourage a balanced diet rich in fruits, vegetables, and dairy products, which contribute to strong teeth and gums.
- Protect Teeth During Play: If your child participates in contact sports, consider using a mouthguard to protect their teeth from injury.
- Teach Good Habits: Teach your child to cover their mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing to prevent the spread of bacteria that can contribute to tooth decay.

Regular dental check-ups and consistent at-home care play a crucial role in ensuring the dental health of young children. Consulting with a pediatric dentist is recommended if you have specific concerns or questions. (cdc.gov)

Children's Dental Health

February is National Children's Dental Health Month. Cavities, also known as caries or tooth decay, are the most common chronic disease of childhood, yet cavities are preventable. Children who have poor oral health often miss more school and receive lower grades than children who don't. Learn how you can protect your child's teeth from cavities with these resources.

Untreated cavities can cause pain, infections, and can lead to problems eating, speaking, and learning. More than 1 in 5 children aged 2 to 5 years has at least one cavity in their baby teeth. Children from low-income families are more than twice as likely to have untreated cavities, compared with children from higher-income households. However, cavities are preventable. You can <u>protect and maintain your child's teeth</u> by following these wise simple steps below:

P-E-A-R-L-S of Wisdom

<u>Protect tiny teeth</u> by caring for your mouth when you're pregnant. Your child's future oral health starts with you.

Ensure to wipe your baby's gums after each meal.

Avoid putting babies to bed with a bottle.

Remember to brush your child's teeth twice daily with fluoride toothpaste. For children younger than 2 years, consult with your dentist or doctor about when to start using fluoride toothpaste.

Limit drinks and food with added sugars for children. Encourage your child to eat more fruits and vegetables and have fewer fruit drinks, cookies, and candies. This gives your child the best possible start to good oral health.

Schedule your child's first dental visit by their first birthday or after their first tooth appears. Their tiny teeth matter!

Root of It All: Are You Watching What Your Child Eats and Drinks?

Your child's diet is very important for developing and maintaining strong and healthy teeth. It is helpful to include good sources of calcium (yogurt, broccoli, and milk) in your child's diet to help build strong teeth. Teaching your child about healthy eating habits is one of the best practices for a lifetime of good health. Here are some helpful tips:

• Eat fruits and vegetables for snacks rather than candies and cookies.

- Brush your child's teeth twice daily.
- Serve water at mealtime rather than juice or soda.

Did You Know That Community Water Fluoridation Saves Money and Teeth?

Fluoride is a naturally occurring element in water. <u>Community water</u> <u>fluoridation</u> is the process of adjusting the amount of fluoride found in water to achieve the best prevention of tooth decay.

- Bacteria in the mouth produce acid when a person eats sugary foods. This
 acid eats away minerals from the tooth's surface, making the tooth weaker
 and increasing the chance of developing cavities.
- Drinking tap water with fluoride rebuilds the surface of the tooth. By keeping the tooth strong and solid, fluoride protects teeth from decay.
- Community water fluoridation has been shown to save money, both for families and the health care system.
- Check if your water has fluoride by visiting My Water's Fluoride.

School Dental Sealant Programs: A Hidden Gem

<u>Dental sealants</u> are a quick, easy, and painless way to prevent most cavities children get in the permanent back teeth where 9 in 10 cavities occur. Children aged 6 to 11 years without sealants have almost 3 times more first-molar cavities than children with sealants.

School dental sealant programs are an effective way to deliver this highly effective preventive intervention to millions of children who might not receive regular dental care. Increasing sealant use among low-income children can greatly reduce tooth decay.

As a parent, ask your child's dentist to apply sealants when appropriate. If your child's school has a sealant program, sign your child up to participate. If they don't, ask your child's school to start one.



- 1. Parents and providers, if you cannot drop off the attendance forms at the various black drop box locations, you may email the attendance forms to the following email address: rrinfo@trcac.org. Please do not email Case Managers the attendance forms. Please note if you email the attendance forms, we do not need the originals, as the electronic version is acceptable. However, please retain the originals for your records.
- 2. Effective February 1, 2024, the subsidized cost definition for part-time vs. full-time care is changing to the following: under 25 hours is considered part-time care, and 25 and over hours is considered full-time care.

- First: Child protective services, or at-risk of abuse, neglect or exploitation
- Second: Admission priority based on adjusted gross monthly income & family size.

When multiple families are within the same ranking:

- 1. Child with exceptional needs within the same ranking is admitted first
- 2. Entry with the oldest application date is admitted second

Provider Participation

Parental Choice:

It is the parent's right and responsibility to choose an eligible provider that meets their family's need for child care and development services. Participants are encouraged to choose a clean, healthy and safe environment for their child(ren). Step 1: Think About Your Child Care Options

When considering your options, sure you take into consideration how well the provider or program fit your child's needs, your family's schedule, location & language.

TrustLine License-Exempt Child Care

- Providers include relatives (grandparents, aunts, uncles), other relatives, friends & neighbors
- Other family, friends and neighbors must be fingerprinted
- Care is provided in the provider's home No licensing requirements

Child Care Center

- · Facilities that provide care for infants, toddlers, preschoolers and/or school-age children
- Care is provided in non-home facilities such as churches, schools and/or licensed buildings
 Group sizes are large allowing for children to have rich social
- and academic experiences
- Primary caregivers are required to have (or be in the process of completing) 12 units of Early Childhood Education
- · Centers are licensed and are regulated by the state

Licensed Family Child Care Home (FCCH)

- Providers are in a home setting for children of An assistant is required when more than 6 to 8 children mixed ages
- * Large FCCH-cares for up to 14 children and
- requires an assistant Capacity of 14 children with no more than 3 infants, when at least 2 children are 6 years of age or older
- · Small FCCH-cares for up to 8 children
- Group sizes are smaller allowing for individualized care
- · Staff are CPR/First Aid and Health and Safety certified
- · Often are able to provide a flexible schedule including,
- evening, weekend or overnight care
 FCCH's are licensed and are regulated by the state

Step 2: Begin Your Search

- · Call Child Care Resource

- · Child Care Resource & Referral can give you a list of licensed child
- Obtain information on the elements of quality child care

Step 3: Visit, Observe & Ask Questions

- Visit the child care while other children are present
- Use a checklist to help you decide what things about a child care arrangement are most important to your family

Step 4: Make a Choice & Stay Involved

- · Watch carefully & visit unannounced
- · Have regular parent-provider meetings
- · Is your child happy, are they learning?
- · If you are not comfortable with your choice, is it okay to change

Parents who choose a licensed provider have the right and responsibility to view any licensing information regarding site visits to their provider's facility or records regarding complaints. Call Community Care Licensing at 1-844-538-8766 for information about facility reports. Family, Friends, & Neighbors (FFN)





The Friends, Family, and Neighbor (FFN) program is a Child Care Resource and Referral initiative aimed at supporting caregivers who provide care for children in their own homes. The program provides resources, training, and guidance to FFN caregivers to help them provide quality care and education to the children in their care. Through the FFN program, caregivers can access a range of services, including referrals to community resources, training and workshops, and support networks. This program recognizes the important role that informal caregivers play in the lives of children and provides them with the tools and resources they need to provide safe, nurturing, and stimulating environments for the children in their care.

FFNs build stable foundations for young children, and are an irreplaceable and essential part of the mixed delivery child care system.
