Keep Your Child Safe: Lead in Baby Foods

Heavy metals like lead, arsenic, cadmium and mercury can be found in baby foods and juices. Heavy metals, like lead, can make it hard for children to learn and pay attention. Most children who have lead poisoning do not look or act sick. Lead adds up in the body over time, so it is important to reduce lead exposure from all sources.



How Can I Keep My Child Safe?

- Wash hands often, especially before eating
- Use lead-safe dishware and cold water for drinking, cooking and formula
- Feed your child healthy meals and snacks when possible, with a variety of vegetables, fruits, grains, dairy and proteins
- Use this table to limit foods that are higher risk for heavy metals and find safer options

Try:

| Cereals or snacks with rice or rice flour | Oatmeal, quinoa, multi-grain cereal, fruit, yogurt, cheese and eggs.  |
| Teething biscuits for teething pain | Frozen banana slices, cold peeled cucumber or a clean cold wet washcloth or spoon (watch for choking).  |
| Veggies that grow underground, like carrots and sweet potatoes can have heavy metals | Serve a variety of fruits and vegetables in whole or puree form. |
| Juice, especially apple, pear, and grape can have lead and arsenic | Breastmilk and/or formula are recommended for the first year of life. Water and milk are safer drink choices for children over one.  |

If you think your child may have been exposed to lead, ask your child's doctor about taking a blood lead test.


